Assistant Professor, Tenure Track

The Department of Family Practice at the University of British Columbia together with the University of Northern British Columbia is seeking to appoint a Family Physician to a full-time, tenure-track position at the rank of Assistant Professor. This position is based in Prince George with the Northern Medical Program.

The UBC Faculty of Medicine, Department of Family Practice is dedicated to improving the health of the people of British Columbia. The Department provides leadership to train clinical faculty, stimulate and facilitate academic and community-based research and education that addresses the needs of communities. Our large complement of over 2,500 academic, clinical, and adjunct faculty members provides exceptional opportunities for partnerships and mentoring within the Department as well as a wide range of scholarly and interdisciplinary opportunities across the Faculty of Medicine and other UBC departments. Faculty members within the Department of Family Practice conduct research that spans a wide scope from aboriginal peoples' health to prevention of chronic disease to social epidemiology, midwifery and maternal care, health services, systems and policy research.

The successful candidate will have certification from the College of Family Physicians of Canada or the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada and be eligible for licensing in the Province of BC. Candidates must demonstrate their ability to establish a strong and dynamic independent research program, be able to attract external funding to support their program and demonstrate their potential to contribute to the educational program for medical students.

Reporting jointly to the UBC Department Head of Family Practice and the Regional Associate Dean, Northern Medical Program, the successful candidate will be expected to provide leadership in Continuing Medical Education (CME), advocate for an expanded residency program in Northern BC and engage Northern Health physicians in the Northern Medical Program. The successful applicant will show demonstrated potential for excellence in teaching and will be expected to provide mentorship and training to University undergraduate, graduate and postgraduate trainees as well as participate in the teaching activities of the UBC Department of Family Practice. The successful candidate will hold a M.D. The candidate will be expected to mount an independent research program in a specific area of family practice, publish peer reviewed publications and apply for operational and scholarship support from local and regional organizations. The incumbent will also contribute to shared academic service activities.

The anticipated start date is 1 July 2017, or upon a date to be mutually agreed. Applications will be accepted until the position is filled. Salary is commensurate with qualifications and experience.
